
Insider's Guide

TO SENIOR LIVING COMMUNITIES









Visiting senior living communities is very exciting! You can get a feel for what your life would be like at the community and see first-hand how their benefits really can enhance your everyday life. Talking to residents will give you some perspective on each senior living community's personality.

Use this guided checklist when visiting a senior living community to take notes and write down questions to help you evaluate the community as a whole. These senior living communities not only offer a lifestyle full of independence and choice, but also a fresh way of thinking about retirement.

With each visit, pay attention to the way you are greeted. Also, be sure that you see every area of the community and all your questions are answered. It's easier to make a decision when you have all the information you need!

LOCATION

Location is important because you want to make sure the community's surroundings are something you will enjoy for years.

Do the roads within the community look well cared for?	
Is there easy access to the highway?	
Is there a university, college or community college close by?	
Is there ample parking? Garages included? Underground or covered parking available?	

STAFF

Pay attention to the staff as you walk around. Are they eager to help you with anything and provide answers to any questions?

Are they approachable and eager to help?	
What is the staff-to-resident ratio?

ATMOSPHERE

Take a close look at the interiors and exteriors of the buildings and the feeling you get walking around. This could be your new home!

Are the common areas clean and free of clutter?	
Is the noise level appropriate for common areas (too quiet, loud or just right)?	
Do the common areas seem full of life?

Are the rooms, halls and buildings easy to navigate?	

AMENITIES

There are different amenities and benefits offered at each senior living community. There are probably certain aspects that are important to you. Which benefits stand out and get you excited about the community?

Is there an on-site salon, library, bank, convenience store, etc.?	
Which areas offer Internet within the community?	
What maintenance is provided inside and outside the residences?	

ACTIVITIES

Everyone enjoys different levels of activity to fill their social calendars; it is all about personal preference. The community most likely offers a variety of activities for you to choose from; some you know you are keen on and others you may have never tried.

Is there a fitness center with up-to-date equipment?

Are there outdoor walking paths within the surrounding landscape?	
Are there areas for picnics, barbecues, gardening and other outdoor activities?	

SECURITY & SAFETY

It is important to get to know your surroundings before moving into a senior living community. Knowing the safety features of the community will be helpful. Keep these things in mind while walking around the community.

Does the community have a plan in case of severe weather?	
What emergency response system is available inside the residences?	
Is there a daily check-in system?

LIVING SPACE

When you are considering moving out of your own house and into a senior living community, it is imperative to be very detailed in your evaluation to make the decision-making process easier. This could be your new home, so it should feel warm and welcoming to you!

Are there varying floor plan options (I-, 2-, 3-bedroom, cottages)?	
How much space is allotted for storage?	
Does each residence include appliances? Which ones?	
Is there ample closet space?	
Is there laundry access within the residences or in a common area?	
Can personal upgrades be made to the residences, such as painting, blinds, etc.?	
Do the residences have a balcony, patio, etc.?	

RESIDENTS

Getting to know new people can be really fun. As you are visiting a community, see if you can get a feeling of what it would be like to live there and who your neighbors would be. You should get a sense of belonging and camaraderie.

Are residents interacting and engaging with you and one another?	
Does it seem like residents are genuinely enjoying their time at the community?	
Is there a resident association at the community that listens to feedback and implements new ideas?	
Is there a Resident Services Director to help acclimate you into the community?	
Are there various resident support groups?	

COMFORT LEVEL

Following your instincts while visiting a community is an excellent way to know whether you think you'll fit in as a resident. A feeling of excitement to find out more information is a good indication the community may be just what you are looking for!
